The tenth anniversary edition of viennacontemporary stands out with unique curated sections, talks, guided tours, performances, art prizes, and more.



The tenth-anniversary edition of Austria's leading international art fair, viennacontemporary, will take place under the artistic direction of Francesca Gavin from September 12 to 15, 2024 in Halle D of Messe Wien. With an exhibitor list comprising 98 galleries and 6 institutional stands from a total of 24 countries, the upcoming edition of viennacontemporary is the largest in years.

An annual highlight in the international art calendar kicking off the art fair season, viennacontemporary is known as a place for discovering new and emerging artists as well as a gateway to the rich art worlds of Central and Eastern Europe, reaffirming Vienna's historical position as a cultural bridge between these regions.



VCT STATEMENT: The Color of Energy

Fifteen international artists reflect in two chapters at viennacontemporary and Salzburger Kunstverein about climate, possible futures, and sustainability.

The Color of Energy reflects on the energy flows essential to understanding the dynamics of today's world. Curated by Mirela Baciak, the exhibition explores our entanglements with sun, wind, oil, coal, gas, and metals, highlighting how the varying intensities of energy connect politics and culture.

Focussing on a sensory exploration of the narratives and debates surrounding energy, the exhibition develops a chromatic dialogue. Various and manifold issues are examined, such as climate anxiety, environmental exploitation, the invisibility of oil, overlooked histories of settler colonialism, child labor in coal mining, and the potential of electricity.

At the fair, Sophie Jung will present a new performance that explores the profound grief tied to the climate crisis, using mythical and contemporary allegories to transform this frustration into collective action. Linda Lach's compositions will examine how sensitive data is maintained and protected, drawing parallels to ecosystems and homeostasis; challenging traditional anthropocentric views of technology. Shubigi Rao's work will address the impoverished and dying landscapes resulting from settler extraction, emphasizing how these processes, particularly fossil fuel and rare metal mining, necessitate the destruction of topsoil and fertility. Judith Fegerl will capture energy and tension in objects that push the boundaries of traditional sculpture through the conduit of electric currents. Bertille Bak's video installation *Mineur Mineur* will reflect on her personal history – her grandparents were Polish miners conscripted into the coal mines of Northern



France at 13 – to confront the issue of child labor: a persistent scourge that still robs approximately 150 million children worldwide of their childhood, dignity, and health.

Several of the works examine contexts in the Scandinavian region, or in lands occupied by Russia. Veronika Hapchenko will evoke visions of the future and space with her painting *Demeter after Ivan Lytovchenko* (2023) – a reinterpretation of Ivan Litovchenko's 1982 mosaic *Creation*, made in Ukraine – that reflects on the moment in time before the Chernobyl disaster. Oleksiy Radynski's film *Where Russia Ends* (2024) is an essayistic road movie that will interrogate the overlooked histories of colonialism and environmental destruction in Russia-occupied indigenous lands. Liv Bugge's film will unite archival footage, documentation of Norwegian oil fields – a cornerstone of Norway's affluence – and scenes of individuals intimately engaging with crude oil, juxtaposing Norway's old and new romanticisms. Bugge's work stirs the public discourse on oil's paradox as a treasured yet problematic resource, deeply woven into social fabric.

Mirela Baciak (1987, Warsaw) is a curator in the field of visual arts whose practice is guided by the notion of hospitality as a process that captures one's ethical relation to the unknown and the strange. Since July 2023 she has been the director at Salzburger Kunstverein, where she just revealed her first exhibition program under the title Chronic Contradictions. Between 2019 and June 2023 she served as curator at steirischer herbst festival and worked at Public Art Munich 2018. She has held residencies and fellowships worldwide, contributing to exhibitions and research projects. Baciak earned an MA in Critical Studies from the Academy of Fine Arts in Vienna and co-founded the AAC | Austrian Association of Curators in 2023.

Introducing CONTEXT

The new section CONTEXT presents important positions from the late 20th century that have shaped Austria's contemporary art scene.

A new section for the fair, CONTEXT draws a line from the contemporary moment back to the invention and rich history of art in Central and Eastern Europe, introducing nine solo presentations of artists from the late 20th century.

Curated by Pernilla Holmes, CONTEXT highlights artists who have been overlooked on the international stage. Asking questions of whose stories are being told today and by whom, six of the nine featured artists are women. Some of these artists developed performative, avant-garde practices that challenged traditional notions of femininity and liberated female desire from the confines of morality, while others challenged the ideology of what their male dominated peers considered "high art".

Including early work of early proponents of groundbreaking developments such as techniques of collage and the principles of abstraction – CONTEXT explores how work by these pioneers continues to influence the Austrian art scene of today.

This year's ZONE1, the fair's section focused on emerging artists with a connection to Austria, will be curated by Bruno Mokross. With ten solo exhibitions of artists who live or have lived in Vienna and are represented by local and international galleries, Mokross wants to examine what attracts international artists to Vienna and how the city's living conditions affect their art.

Mokross says: "Vienna is an attractive bedrock for a diverse cast of aspiring professionals. International artists setting up base in the Austrian capital are citing an improbable constellation of affordable rents, government support, harmonious ecosystems, stable economy, and high living standards in a peaceful, democratic nation—oh, and the water quality!—as motivation.

How might the aspirations of those who came to stay contrast with those who ultimately left? What are the driving desires of a scene shunning the prevalent hustlepreneurship of most art metropolises? Or, in broader terms: how do the conditions under which art is created contribute to shaping it—and how do artists shape those conditions?"

About Bruno Mokross

Bruno Mokross works as an artist, curator, and software developer in Vienna. He runs the independent exhibition space Pech and is one of the founders and main organizers of Independent Space Index, the network and eponymous festival of Viennese project spaces.

ART PRIZES

viennacontemporary announces two open calls for the galleries participating at the fair, in addition to four art prizes, whose winners will be awarded on the fair's opening day.

The second edition of the <u>Sculpture Project</u> by viennacontemporary and JP Immobilien again invites galleries to select one of the artists they represent to submit a proposal for an outdoor sculpture. The selected artist will receive a prize money of 10,000 Euros and an additional production fee of 16,000 Euros. The winning sculpture will be unveiled and exhibited at viennacontemporary 2025 (September 11-14).

Initiated in 2023, the first winner of the Sculpture Project was Carola Dertnig / CRONE Gallery. Her sculpture 'Feldenkreis_FI_001_Lucia Westerguard' was purchased by JP Immobilien and is now gracing the entrance area in front of 'The Hoxton Vienna' hotel.

The new prize is **Art for Stronger Democracies** honors an artist or group of artists whose practice deals with the challenges and/or unique opportunities of democratic societies. In particular, it honors an artist or group of artists whose work contributes to defending democratic achievements, develops fresh ideas for positive democratic change and democratic regeneration, and/or aims to strengthen the role of European civil societies as key participants in an open and constructive democratic dialogue. All galleries participating in viennacontemporary 2024 are invited to take part. The selected artist and gallery will receive a prize money of 5.000 Euros each.

The winners of both open calls will be announced in Spring 2025.

LUKOWA Acquisition Prize

LUKOWA Group is looking to acquire an artwork presented at viennacontemporary 2024, thematically relating to the distribution of power. The idea is to explore ways in which this word and its meaning are present and analyzed in various artistic practices today, with an understanding that the interpretations of this subject can vary greatly. The context the collection is looking for is not limited to political, economic, or social issues, it rather encourages a much broader scope of iterations that can offer unique views on what "power" could mean. The collection allocates up to 5.000 CHF for the acquisition.
